## SPRING CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

### “LIBRARIANS AS LEADERS”

Hunt Dunlap, Western Illinois University

Join us March 27-28 for the 2008 IACRL Spring Conference at the Chateau Hotel and Conference Center in Bloomington, IL. The submitted presentations and invited speakers on this year’s theme,

“Librarians as Leaders: Energizing our Communities,” will explore the future role of academic librarians as we expand our sphere of influence beyond the library. Sessions will demonstrate how each of us, working individually and together, can energize our communities and be the architects of our future.

The conference will feature keynote speaker Dr. Donald J. Waters, formerly the Associate University Librarian at Yale University and currently the Program Officer for Scholarly Communications at the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation (see related article, page 3). The main conference will include approximately forty sessions presented by Illinois academic librarians on topics of current interest related to leadership development, technology application (e.g., podcasting, Facebook), reference and public services, outreach, collection building and much more.

The CARLI-sponsored IACRL pre-conference, “Leading While Libraries are Changing: Conversations about the Future of Academic Libraries” will also be held at The Chateau on March 26. The featured keynote speaker for the pre-conference is Scott Bennett, Yale University Emeritus Librarian. This all-day event will include panel discussions and roundtable “break-out” sessions in the afternoon (see related article,

## 2008 IACRL SPRING CONFERENCE KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Jana Brubaker, Northern Illinois University

The keynote speaker for this year's IACRL Spring Conference will be Dr. Donald J. Waters, currently the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation's Program Officer for Scholarly Communications. His presentation, entitled "The Digital Flip in Academic Libraries," will address the emerging "digital library of the future." Many academic librarians now report that traditional organizational structures, which are oriented to books and journals, are no longer suited to how academic librarianship is currently practiced. Dr. Waters' talk, offered from the perspective of a major US foundation, will highlight some of the key areas where change is occurring; indicate how in the aggregate these changes are transforming the character of academic libraries; suggest how the outcomes remain uncertain; and propose activities on which library leaders might most usefully focus their attention.

Prior to joining the Foundation, Dr. Waters served as the first Director of the Digital Library Federation from 1997 until 1999

and as Associate University Librarian at Yale University from 1993 until 1997. In addition, he has served in a variety of other positions at Yale including the Computer Center and the School of Management.

Dr. Waters graduated with a Bachelor's degree in American Studies from the University of Maryland, College Park in 1973. He received his Ph.D. in Anthropology in 1982 from Yale University. Dr. Waters conducted his dissertation research on the political economy of artisanry in Guyana, South America. He has edited a collection of African-American folklore from the Hampton Institute.

In 1995-96, Dr. Waters co-chaired the Task Force of the Commission on Preservation and Access and the Research Libraries Group on Archiving of Digital Information, and was the editor and a principal author of the Task Force Report. He is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and is also the author of numerous articles and presentations on libraries, digital libraries, digital preservation, and scholarly communications.

In 1995-96, Dr. Waters co-chaired the Task Force of the Commission on Preservation and Access and the Research Libraries Group on Archiving of Digital Information, and was the editor and a principal author of the Task Force Report. He is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and is also the author of numerous articles and presentations on libraries, digital libraries, digital preservation, and scholarly communications.

## **LEADING WHILE LIBRARIES ARE CHANGING :**

### **A MUST ATTEND IACRL PRECONFERENCE**

Are you wondering where you and your library will be in five years? We don't have to look far to see that the world of academic libraries is rapidly and substantially changing. We work in an environment of constantly emerging technologies, new user behaviors, declining budgets, and educational systems more intentionally focused on student learning. More than ever, academic librarians must think out-of-the-box, and plan courageously and strategically for the future.

Once again, CARLI is sponsoring what should be an outstanding IACRL preconference focusing on leadership and changing libraries. The all-day event, called "Leading While Libraries are Changing: Conversations about the Future of Academic Libraries," will take place at The Chateau in Bloomington on March 26. The preconference will feature keynote speaker Scott Bennett, Yale University Emeritus Librarian, framing the day's conversations about the changing library landscape by focusing on how these changes impact

space-planning, services, collections, and behind the scenes operations.

A follow-up panel session will feature five Illinois library leaders, representing a variety of academic library types, discussing their visions and plans for the future. Afternoon sessions will consist of two one-hour blocks of roundtable discussions that will permit participants to discuss changes in specific aspects of professional practice (e.g. reference, instruction, technical services, administration, consortia, liaison activities, and administration/management). A final debriefing will bring together all of the ideas and plans developed, and to initiate next steps.

Organized by CARLI's Public Services Working Group, the program will be free to CARLI members and \$50 for non-CARLI members. Lunch will be provided. Registration should be available early in February on the CARLI site with a link to registration from the IACRL website's conference page (<http://www.iacrl.net>).

## NOMINATIONS: ILLINOIS ACADEMIC LIBRARIAN OF THE YEAR

IACRL annually bestows the Illinois Academic Librarian of the Year Award, which recognizes individuals who have made significant contributions to academic or research librarianship, and particularly those whose activities have had notable effects within Illinois. The award will be presented at ILA's Annual Conference, to be held this year at Chicago's Navy Pier in October. This is a wonderful opportunity to honor the achievements of friends and colleagues.

A nominee should have demonstrated achievement in one or more of the following areas:

- Service to the organized profession through ILA, IACRL, and related organizations.
- Significant and influential academic or research library service.
- Contributions to the development of academic or research librarianship through research or publication.
- Planning and implementing a library program of exemplary quality.

Submissions must consist of a letter explaining how the nominee meets the criteria. If possible, a vita or resume should be included. Other documentation, such as letters of support, will also be considered. The deadline for nominations is May 15, 2008. Letters and supporting documentation should be sent to the ILA office.
